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2. BACKGROUND & EXPERIENCE

Organization Description

Myceliet is a Swedish non-profit association established in 2026, purpose-built to contribute to the European project ecosystem as a focused, practitioner-led Swedish partner. Our founding team brings direct professional

experience — not theoretical interest — in the domains we work across: artisan food production, AI-enhanced tool and application development, adult learning facilitation, digital skills training, integrative health and wellbeing, and rural cultural heritage stewardship.

The association takes its name from the biological mycelium — the underground network connecting organisms and enabling resource sharing. This is our philosophy: lasting change grows through networks of knowledge and genuine human partnership. We exist to build those networks across borders, disciplines, and communities.

Alignment with EU Policy Priorities 2026–2027

Myceliet's work is directly and explicitly aligned with the key frameworks that govern Erasmus+ funding and EU education policy. In addition to the four horizontal priorities, Myceliet's work aligns directly with the European Commission's Union of Skills (March 2025) — the overarching EU strategy focused on investment in adult and lifelong learning, skills development for quality lives and quality jobs, and enabling all people to navigate the green and digital transitions. Our programmes contribute specifically to:

- Building skills for quality lives — not only labour market skills, but the food literacy, health competences, and digital capabilities that enable people to live well and participate fully in society
- Upskilling and reskilling for the green and digital transition — AI literacy and sustainable food production knowledge as practical skills for 21st-century livelihoods
- Inclusion of groups in rural and remote areas — a group explicitly named in both Erasmus+ 2026 priorities and the Union of Skills as underserved in current skills frameworks
- Micro-credentials and non-formal learning — our workshop formats are designed as short, replicable, recognisable learning units aligned with the EU's emerging micro-credential framework

Our Six Practice Areas — Linked to EU Policy

1. AI & Future Learning → Erasmus+ Priority 3 • Union of Skills

Artificial intelligence is transforming how humans learn, work, and create. Myceliet's founding team has built AI-enhanced digital applications and integrated generative AI tools into practical workflows. In EU project contexts, we contribute AI-integrated learning module design, AI literacy content for adult learners unfamiliar with new technologies, and ethics-aware approaches to AI that prioritise human development over technological novelty. This directly addresses the Erasmus+ 2026 digital transformation priority, which explicitly names 'purposeful use of emerging digital technologies and innovation, including AI, in education and training.'

2. Sustainable Food Systems & Artisan Craft → Erasmus+ Priority 2 • New European Bauhaus

We celebrate food as one of Europe's deepest cultural expressions — from cacao origin and bean-to-bar artisan production to traditional fermentation and food heritage. Our hands-on experience in artisan food production connects directly to the Erasmus+ 2026 environmental priority, which explicitly supports 'sustainable food and transport options' and 'lifestyle changes and consumption habits in line with the New European Bauhaus initiative.' Artisan food production is not only cultural — it is a model of the green economy: low-footprint, high-skill, locally embedded.

3. Health & Human Potential → Erasmus+ Priority 1 • Union of Skills

Health is more than nutrition. We take an integrative view of human wellbeing: physical vitality, mental health, food literacy, movement, rest, and social connection. The Erasmus+ 2026 inclusion priority explicitly names 'equity, equality and mental health of participants' as outcomes to be fostered. The Union of Skills likewise frames its goal as 'quality lives' — not just productive workers. Our health programmes address the whole person, reaching groups for whom access to wellbeing knowledge and practice is limited by geography, income, or social circumstance.

4. Rural Heritage & Living History → Erasmus+ Priority 4 • Inclusion Priority

The countryside holds centuries of embedded knowledge: agricultural traditions, craft skills, historic landscapes, and the memory of how communities have lived with and shaped their environments. We document, protect, and activate rural heritage — not as museum exhibits but as living resources for sustainable futures. The Erasmus+ 2026 civic engagement priority explicitly supports 'European cultural identity, cultural awareness and social and historical heritage,' while the inclusion priority specifically names 'people living in rural and remote areas' as a group to be reached. Rural heritage work addresses both simultaneously.

5. European Collaboration & EU Projects → All priorities

As an active Erasmus+ partner, we build transnational projects that produce lasting, open-access learning resources and genuine cross-cultural understanding. We bring Swedish thematic depth, a reliable partnership style, and an understanding of EU policy language that helps consortia write stronger, more policy-aligned proposals. We actively seek project invitations from coordinators across all relevant programme strands, particularly KA220-ADU (adult education) and KA210 (small-scale partnerships).

6. Digital Skills & Community Building → Erasmus+ Priority 3 • Union of Skills

Digital fluency is a 21st-century basic right. We help individuals and communities develop practical digital competences — with specific attention to groups at risk of exclusion from the digital transition. The Erasmus+ 2026 digital transformation priority explicitly includes 'digital well-being' and support for organisations to 'manage an effective shift towards digital education.' Our community-centred approach ensures digital skills are not only transmitted but embedded in supportive social contexts that make learning sustainable.

Robert is largely self-taught in the digital field — a background that has become one of his core strengths. Having navigated the learning curve himself, he understands first-hand what makes technology feel difficult or intimidating, and how to remove those barriers for others. His particular focus is on making AI approachable: less daunting, more understandable, and firmly positioned as an essential tool for the future rather than a threat. This perspective is of direct practical value in adult education contexts, where learner apprehension toward new technology is often the single greatest obstacle — and it embodies the non-formal and informal learning pathways that the Erasmus+ programme itself seeks to promote and validate.

His focus is on the digital tools and platforms that make collaborative projects run well — from documentation and coordination to communication and follow-up — a competence of direct value in EU partnerships, where distributed teams across multiple countries depend on well-chosen digital infrastructure and clear communication. A skilled communicator in both speech and writing, he brings a constructive, positive energy to collaborative work. He works in Swedish and English.

4. EU PROJECT EXPERIENCE

Myceliet was established in 2026 and does not yet hold an independent EU project record as an organisation. We are fully transparent on this point — experienced coordinators deserve accurate partner information, and the EU's own guidance on small-scale partnerships explicitly acknowledges that this format is 'dedicated to organisations without experience in the Erasmus+ Programme.'

What we offer in place of a project list is a purposefully assembled partnership profile: practitioners with direct domain expertise across our six focus areas; a thematic niche that addresses all four Erasmus+ 2026 horizontal priorities; and a close working relationship with two established EU project organisations — Tropical Astral Lda (PT, 28 years of EU project engagement) and Learnmera Oy (FI, 50+ EU projects, experienced Erasmus+ coordinator). Any consortium including Myceliet benefits from this institutional depth alongside our thematic focus.

Note: The EU's own KA210 Small-scale Partnerships route requires only one partner from another EU country and is specifically designed for organisations building their first Erasmus+ experience. Myceliet is well-positioned to participate in KA210 projects as a first step toward full KA220 Cooperation Partnerships.
